

Pet Preparedness

- **Pet Emergency Plan**

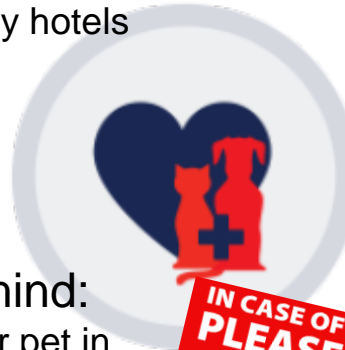
- Pet tags and ID are current and up to date. Consider microchipping.
- **Make a kit:** Food, bottled water, meds, vet records, food dishes, first aid kit, etc.
- **Research shelters:** Not all shelters accept animals for public health reasons. Research pet friendly hotels and any shelters that accept animals.

- **During a Disaster**

- Evacuate with your pet!
- **No alternative – Leaving you pet behind:** Consider precautions: You may be leaving your pet in great danger. Place pet in a safe area of your house. Do not leave them outdoors! Leave plenty of water and food. Place a notice on your door or window advising what pets, how many, where they are located, and you and your vet's contact information.

- **After a Disaster**

- Keep your pets leashed when outside. Familiar scents and landmarks may be altered and your pet may become confused and lost. Snakes and other dangerous animals may be brought into flood areas. Pets may become scared after a disaster and may become aggressive or defensive.
